Business As Usual at Morgantown Municipal Airport

Regular flyers can still expect to find flights and make their trips on time.



MORGANTOWN – Morgantown Municipal Airport management is stating with confidence that the airport is continuing “business as usual” after Pinnacle Airlines, Corp. filed for bankruptcy on Sunday.

The airline, based in Memphis, Tennessee, listed assets of \$1.5 billion and liabilities of \$1.4 billion in the Chapter 11 filing in U.S. Bankruptcy Court in New York three days ago.

However, this does not affect what airlines are currently offering service to Morgantown Airport. Colgan Air, Inc, operating as United Airlines Express at Morgantown, is a subsidiary of Pinnacle Airlines, and will continue to send people to any destination they choose.

"Pinnacle will continue its three-flights-a-day to Washington, D.C. to Dulles International Airport, and there you have connections to the world," said Michael Clow, Executive Director of the Morgantown Municipal Airport. “We want the community to know that there's no change here. You can still come to the airport and get on a plane and make your trip as usual."

Colgan Air assumed the commercial flight service on May 1, 2007, and has maintained an excellent service record for on-schedule flights to and from Morgantown Municipal Airport operating the new SAAB-340B passenger airplane.
