The Green-Network Plan is in the initial stages of development by a group of the area's green space organization volunteers, the West Virginia Land Trust, and city and county representatives. This Green Night Community Dialogue is the first in a series of meetings to engage local citizens and experts in green space and alternative transportation in generating ideas and opportunities and begin working on improving the area's green space and alternative transportation network infrastructure.
