

ORDINANCE

AN ORDINANCE DESIGNATING A PORTION OF THE PRICE STREET NEIGHBORHOOD OF THE CITY OF MORGANTOWN, AS A DESIGNATED PERMIT PARKING DISTRICT PURSUANT TO ARTICLE 367 OF THE MORGANTOWN CITY CODE: DEFINING THE BOUNDARIES THEREOF; AND DIRECTING THAT THE STREETS IN THE DISTRICT BE SIGNED ACCORDINGLY.

The City of Morgantown hereby Ordains:

ESTABLISHMENT OF DISTRICT:

There is hereby established within the City of Morgantown pursuant to Article 367 of the Morgantown City Code a Designated Parking District to be bounded as described below, and to be identified as the "Price Street Designated Parking District".

BOUNDARIES OF DISTRICT:

The District shall be bounded as follows:

The Price Street Designated Parking District shall be limited to the properties included within the boundaries delineated on the attached map which is declared to be a part of this ordinance.

SIGNING OF STREETS:

The City Manager shall cause all streets within the above Designated Parking District to be signed as follows:

"PERMIT PARKING ONLY, except 7:00 p.m. to 11:00 p.m."

PERMITS AVAILABLE:

Two (2) regular parking permits and one (1) visitor permit can be issued for each residential dwelling unit in this permit parking district.

APPLICABILITY OF OTHER PARKING RESTRICTIONS:

Nothing contained herein shall be construed as permitting the parking of any vehicle in any properly marked "no parking" or restricted parking area or in violation of any other City ordinance or law.

This Ordinance shall be effective as of the date of adoption.





All participants of the attached petition have expressed strong awareness of the parking problems on Mansion Ave.

University High School students take all existing parking places during the day, and during school activities in the evenings.

On many occasions University students and other individuals use Mansion Ave for free parking while they attend classes or work downtown. They also park here evenings and nights while attending Fraternity functions.

There are several retired homeowners on the street who are adversely affected by the inability to park in front of their residences. In many instances it is impossible to find parking space even in the surrounding streets when returning home during school hours. Also, the lack of parking presents a problem for visitors and service personnel.

These are the reasons to petition for 24 hrs. permit parking on Mansion Ave. This will assure that the homeowners and other residents will be able to park in front of their homes and eliminate transient traffic.

All participants of the attached petition have expressed a strong awareness of the parking problems particular to this area. Price Street is a forty-eight hour parking street where cars are consistently parked for extended periods. Individuals frequently drop their cars off for weeks at a time. There is also noticeable parking pressure from the increasing population of the University High School in recent years related to student, parent, and school activity parking. In addition many commuters are attracted to this area simply for the free parking close to town and campus. This presents very little opportunity for parking in an area where you reside. This also presents a problem for visitor parking at residents homes. This is the basis for the request of permit parking for designated areas on Price Street, between Cornell Avenue and Belmar Avenue. We hope this effort will decrease transient traffic while improving the street access for these area residents.

Dear Commission Members,

Recently I received notice that the Commission had been petitioned to consider a permit parking district in the neighborhood from Fife Avenue to University High School. While in support of such a district, there are some areas which should remain no parking. These areas are:

1. Price Street from Cornell Avenue to University High School. Traffic on Price Street is very great, especially when the students come and go from High School and currently there is considerable jamming. When snow and ice is on the street slipping and sliding is a great problem and parking would add to the dilemma. The street is too steep and dangerous for parking.
2. Mansion Ave. Parking on Mansion Ave. should be prohibited for the first 50 ft at the intersection with Price St. The school buses have great difficulty turning the corner and cars parked on Mansion makes it even more difficult.

3. Brown Street, Why would permit parking be considered for a one lane street?

4. Cornell Avenue, In my judgement no parking should be allowed on either side of Cornell Ave. from Willey St. to the corner of Price St. When snow and ice are present it poses very grave risks to property and person. The street is very steep.

Finally, as you can note I live at 908 Price Street and daily cope with the large number of vehicles that are in the neighborhood because of University High School and West Virginia University. It is a scary time each morning and afternoon when the High School students, their relatives and friends zoom through the area. Please do not increase the risks to those living in the neighborhood by granting permit parking on either side of Price Street between Cornell Avenue and University High School.

RE: Proposed Permitted Parking Fife, Willey, Price, etc.

As an owner of property, rental, not home, I have mixed emotions on this proposal.

1. This would be very nice for the homeowners and students living here. It would have to be on a 24-hour basis, since this is an area where people park 24 hours a day. It is probably a bad parking area as more students live here than there are parking spaces, where as in South Park students come in for day classes at MHS and then ~~leave~~ ^{leave} so the 7-7 is okay.

2. Do people need to pay for permits--this is going to be a difficult task getting students to come in and pay for permits. Also, since students are here in apartments sometimes for less than a year, how do you get the permits back so you can issue permits to the next tenants. I see some overlap here which means more permits than parking all the time. If the permits had to be given back, if they left then you could not keep track of this without much difficulty. I AM NOT FAMILIAR AS TO HOW YOU GET PERMITS FOR SOUTH PARK NOW so not sure how the procedure would work.

3. Thus, I feel that this would have to be policed quite often and my questions is--do we have the man power and money to do this? And I don't believe we do.
