Dear Property Owner:

The City's Planning and Zoning Code requires notification of property owners within two hundred (200) feet of a site where certain land development and/or land use decisions are required by the Planning Commission or Board of Zoning Appeals.

Nicholas Romanoli on behalf of Dave Flores has applied for conditional use approval for the property located at 130 Fayette St. A map is enclosed with this letter illustrating the location of the subject site (highlighted in light blue).

The Board of Zoning Appeals will consider this petition at a public hearing on **Wednesday, February 18, 2026, at 6:30 p.m.** The public hearing will be held in **Morgantown City Hall – City Council Chambers, 389 Spruce Street (2nd Floor), Morgantown, WV.**

Project Description:

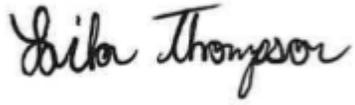

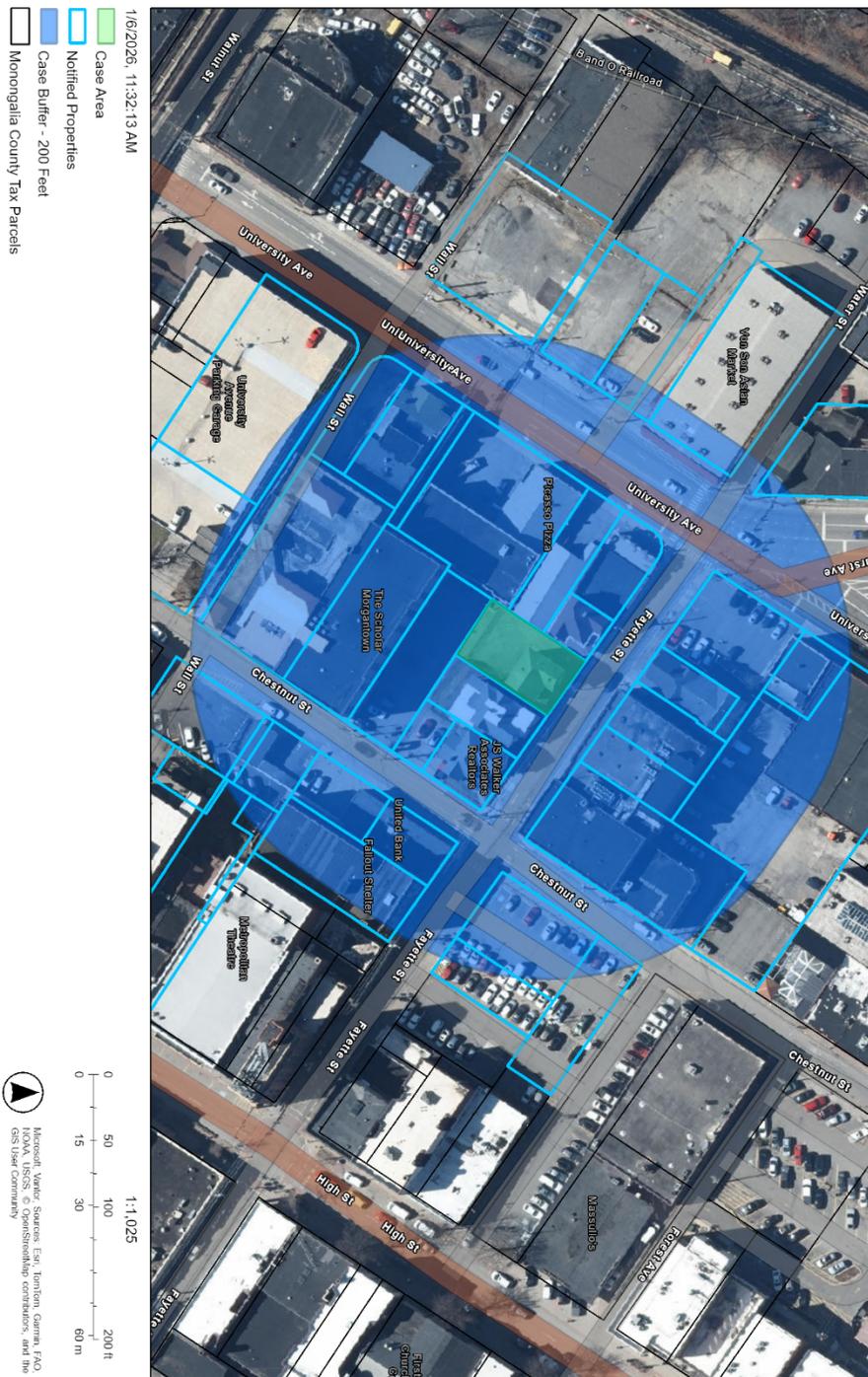

Members of the public may participate in an existing case before the Board of Zoning Appeals (BZA) in several ways:

- Provide a written submission (evidence such as reports, photographs, etc.) while the record is open. Evidence supporting the granting or denial of an application may be submitted to the Office of the Planning Division up to five (5) days prior to the public meeting. Written evidence submitted after the deadline cannot be considered by the BZA unless the BZA

finds good cause exists to admit additional evidence at the time of the hearing.

- Provide written comments for the public hearing. Written comments may be submitted to the Office of the Planning Division prior to the public meeting OR by presenting them to the BZA Chair at the hearing. Written comments that are lengthy but not considered evidence can be submitted up to five (5) days prior to the public meeting to allow ample time to distribute them to members of the BZA with sufficient time for review.
- Offer testimony during the public hearing portion at the BZA meeting. All speakers are limited to five (5) minutes. If there is a large number of speakers, including many who are part of groups or organizations, the BZA Chairperson may, to avoid repetitive comments, elect to ask a representative to speak on behalf of the group or organization.
